The reason that men's brains change size so drastically may have to do with fuel efficiency. The female brain seems able to reduce its metabolic rate – that is, its use of brain glucose – over time, whereas older men metabolize glucose, at higher rates than when they were younger.

But while women's brains are more durable, they aren't impervious to the effects of aging. Some studies have indicated that out of four people affected by Alzheimer's disease, three are women. According to some studies, estrogen replacement therapy may reduce the risk and delay the symptoms of the disease in women.
